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ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Matraville Sports High School is a co-educational community high school, in spacious grounds, providing a supportive, caring learning environment for all students. It offers quality academic and sporting facilities, and incorporates a variety of traditional, challenging and innovative courses designed to meet the needs of all students. Students enjoy the advantages of a school where they are known, valued and cared for by a dynamic staff in a small school setting. The school offers the opportunity for all students to connect, thrive and succeed in a supportive environment. Parents and the community are encouraged to participate in the school and, in particular, their child's learning. Acceptance and respect for all cultures is encouraged and the school is recognised for its friendship and tolerance. Our Talented Sports Program provides a unique opportunity for students with a special aptitude for sporting activities. Students enrolled in the program are given the opportunity to excel in their particular sport within a curriculum framework that supports them in reaching their academic and sporting goals. The school and its traditional curriculum remains open to all students in the local drawing area and others on application.

The Clontarf Academy program operates within the school to improve the education, discipline, life skills, self-esteem and employment prospects of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men by doing so equips them to participate more meaningfully in society.

The **Inclusive Learning Centre** at Matraville Sports High School has 5 classes for students with moderate, mild and severe intellectual disabilities.

The **Support Unit** has 3 classes catering for the needs of students with Autism.

These special classes give extra support to students with diagnosed disabilities. All students have the option to access either the mainstream curriculum or Life Skills course.

In 2022 your child begins a comprehensive two-year (stage 4) course that includes Mathematics, English, Science, Languages, Geography, Food Technology, History, AVID, PDHPE, Technology, Visual Arts, Music and Sport. Towards the end of Year 8, students choose elective subjects and a pattern of study for the next two years.

We consider education to be a three-way partnership between the school, the student and parents.

On behalf of the students and staff, I welcome you to our school community and look forward to working with you in the coming years at Matraville Sports High School.

UNSW FUTURE STUDENTS PROGRAM (YEARS 7-10)

Matraville Sports High School offers high quality educational opportunities in the University of NSW Future Students Program. Students are selected at the end of Semester 1 in Year 7 to be placed in this program.

For 2022, as is usually the case, there are currently more applicants for selective high school placements than offers made to students. Most students will miss out on a place. With this in mind, our school has developed a highly successful specialist program for gifted and talented students.

The UNSW Future Students Program at Matraville Sports High School is a program currently operating for selected students from Years 7 to 10 in the core curriculum areas of English, Maths, Science, History and Geography. Teaching programs in these areas are specifically designed to cater for the higher learning ability of the students. Teaching staff receive specialised training to program for and assess High Potential and Gifted students.

The high expectations of the teaching staff have advanced student learning to achieve outstanding outcomes. The program is regularly reviewed. Students and parents have indicated very high levels of satisfaction with what is being achieved. In addition to this, other students displaying potential in particular areas are grouped with the UNSW Future Students Program in their cohort to access similar learning opportunities.

Students will be notified of their place in the UNSW Future Students Program beginning of Term 3, 2023.



AVID

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. It is a program that is designed to increase student learning and performance and prepares students in Years 7–12 to enter tertiary education at the end of their secondary school studies. AVID is an essential part of our strategy to create a school culture that supports high expectations and levels of achievement. Teachers use AVID strategies to develop students' critical thinking, literacy & mathematics skills and explicitly teach students the skills, mindset and behaviours necessary for academic success.

At Matraville Sports High School, we encourage all of our students to strive to be the best they can – we understand that not all students need or want to go to university, but the AVID Program will assist our students to become the kind of people employers will want to hire, companies will want to give apprenticeships to, and develop skills that would assist them to succeed.

Currently, students in years 7, 8, and 11 attend the AVID class three times a week and year 9 three times a fortnight. In this class they are initially taught skills and routines to get organised, stay organised and to use their time effectively. Later in the year they will look at goal setting, social skills and career development, all of which are designed to develop our students into positive members of society. They are also introduced to the Cornell Note making method – which gives them a structure for taking notes in classes and a way to use these notes to revise and study the material. They are asked to take notes in this manner in all of their classes.

Students are also taught WICOR (writing, inquiry, collaboration, and reading) strategies in their AVID class and these strategies are also implemented in all content areas, to help develop deep understanding of the content. Other important elements of the AVID program are its support for leadership development and engagement with the community and with students' families.

Parents are also seen as an important partner in the AVID Program. We encourage parents to be involved with their student's learning, to encourage them to be organised, make good use of their time and to help them succeed in school and beyond.



CLONTARF

The Clontarf Foundation exist to improve the education, discipline, life skills, self-esteem and employment prospects of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men by doing so equips them to participate more meaningfully in society.

Using supportive relationships, a welcoming environment and a diverse range of activities, Clontarf helps young men to attend school, finish year 12 and enter employment. The young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men in our program develop improved self-esteem and confidence which assists them to participate in education, employment and society in a positive way.



SISTA SPEAK

Sista Speak is a program targeted at young Aboriginal girls in years 7- 10. Sista Speak aims to boost our girl's self-esteem, school engagement, attendance, leaderships skills, careers aspirations, personal needs, knowledge about sexual health awareness and the importance of life choices and consequences.

As part of the program, but not limited to, participants take part in:

- Female and youth specific Health and Well-being workshops
- Art Therapy and Cultural Activities
- Career and University Drives
- TAFE Taster Opportunities
- Team Building Activities
- Volunteering & Community initiatives

Sista Speak is supported by and work with a variety of services, support agencies and community organisations who lead and deliver culturally and age appropriate workshops.



LEARNING INITIATIVES

Learning and Support Team

Our Learning and Support Team (LST) is composed of the Deputy Principal, Year Advisers, School counsellor, Learning support and specialist teachers, School Learning Support Officers and Aboriginal Education Officer. The team meet once a fortnight to collaboratively work towards supporting students to succeed academically by providing targeted support. Students can self-refer to request support or referred by parents/ carers or staff members. Students are then supported through tailored services to suit their individual learning needs, such as in class adjustments, individual plans or intensive withdrawal sessions. Each student progress is evaluated and monitored through the Learning Support Team.

Covid-19 Intensive Learning Support Program

COVID Intensive Learning Support Program (COVID ILSP) is a program to help improve educational outcomes for students whose learning has been most impacted by the pandemic. The program will provide targeted small-group tuition for students to improve gaps in their learning.

Duke of Edinburgh's International Award

The Duke of Edinburgh award is a youth development program, empowering all young Australians aged 14-24 to explore their full potential and find their purpose, passion and place in the world, regardless of their location or circumstance. The Award is a fully inclusive program and has no social, political, or religious affiliations.

Urban Koori

The Urban Koori Program is a Matraville Sports High School Aboriginal education initiative. The program aims to provide holistic support to Aboriginal students in mainstream classes, in small group tutorial sessions, timetabled in class support or on an individual basis.

The aims of the program are to:

- Improve educational outcomes from years 7-12
- Raises the retention rates to meet and extend the required 85%
- Engage students in education and educational opportunities
- Establish positive and interactive links to and with the Aboriginal community, school environment and staff

The maximum student intake is ten. Placements are selected against strict criteria and subject to suitability and current program capacity.

Homework Centre

Takes place in the Library every Wednesday afternoon throughout the school term. Students are able to drop in to seek support from staff and UNSW mentors with homework and assessments.

WELLBEING INITIATIVES

Year Advisor

Year Advisors are attached to each year group. The role of the Year Advisor is to support students with their social, emotional, academic and wellbeing needs. They are the primary contact for parents/ carers to contact if you have concerns for your child.

School Counsellor

At Matraville Sports High School we have a full time school counsellor on site to support students. Students are able to self-refer or parents/ carers can seek support for your child if required.

Student Support Officer

The Student Support Officer helps students develop social and emotional skills through targeted strengths-based programs and strategies that build resilience, coping skills and positive relationships.

Wellbeing and Health In Reach Nurse – (WHIN)

At MSHS we are lucky to have a nurse on site one day per week (Mondays) the role of the WHIN is to ensure students can easily access health and social support when they need it. Students/ parents/ carers can request support by the WHIN nurse by calling the school office.

Supported Transition Access Retention Program - STAR Program

This program is offered for students to effectively transition to High School

ARCO

The ARCO is an experienced teacher nominated by the principal. The ARCO is trained to assist students, teachers, parents and community members who have concerns relating to racism in the school or complaints about incidents of racism. The ARCO can assist by:

1. Providing advice on the procedure to resolve concerns or complaints about racism
2. support during the process to reach a resolution.

Raise Mentoring

MSHS staff work with Raise to provide young people with a caring, independent volunteer mentor who shows up each week, just for them. With the time to listen, one-to-one support with a mentor empowers young people to talk through life's challenges and help them cope better, today and in the future.

South's Cares

Souths Cares is an independent not-for-profit public benevolent institution, established to support the local community and address social need across the South Sydney region. Its charter is to support disadvantaged and marginalised youth and their families through the delivery of capacity building programs addressing education, training, health and employment needs.

Centre 360

Centre 360 Youth and Family Service specialises in counselling, case work and, early intervention for disadvantaged young people and their families. Centre 360 provides counselling to eligible students at Matraville Sports High one day per week.

WAYS Youth and Family

WAYS Youth & Family support worker is based at school one day a week. To work with young people and their families to create successful and meaningful pathways to the future. This is achieved through a “one-stop-shop” integrated model of service delivery providing innovative and comprehensive services, specialist staff and programs specifically designed to meaningfully assist young people and their families achieve a range of positive outcomes.

Youth Haven

La Perouse Youth Haven, also known as the La Pa Bummers, provides a culturally appropriate service to young people aged 8-25 years in the La Perouse Aboriginal community.

We are committed to providing cultural, educational and recreational activities to our young people to build their self-esteem, divert them away from anti-social behaviour and improve their skills to realise their full potential that will enable them to become vital, responsible and contributing members of our community.

This program is available to young people connected to the La Perouse Aboriginal Community.

Weekly wellbeing check-in

All students are provided with a weekly check in online survey. This survey is monitored by staff and if students require support they are provided with individualised support.

Strength in Our Mob (SOM)

Strengthening Our Mob is a place-based social and emotional wellbeing program within the La Perouse Aboriginal community in Sydney. The program offers dedicated staff who provide holistic case management support to members of the La Perouse Aboriginal Community who are experiencing or suffering challenging times.

The team, locally known as SOM, often provides support for mob who need support in navigating the justice system, housing support, clinical and medical, employment and education.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Attendance at MSHS is very important. The best indicator for student success is to have high attendance rates. If students have an attendance less than 85%. Parents will be required to attend a meeting at school to discuss how the school can support your child to increase his or her attendance.

SMS - In the event of an absence, an SMS text message will be automatically sent to the mobile phones of parents explaining that our records show that your child is absent from school.

Absence Explanation - An absence note that is dated and signed by the student's parent/carer should state the student's name, roll call class and give the reason for student absence. This must be sent to school within 3 days of your child's return to school.

Late Arrivals - Students should only arrive late for school if there has been an unavoidable situation. Students arriving late must sign in at the Student Attendance Office and have a signed note from a parent/carer explaining the late arrival.

Early Leavers - Students requiring an early leave pass must bring a note from the parent/carer. The note should state clearly the name of the student, the reason leave is requested, the time of leaving and be signed and dated by the parent or carer. Medical and dental appointments should be made out of school time where possible.

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Speak and behave courteously.
- Cooperate with others.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting.
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with property.

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy.
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions.
- Care for self and others.
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour.

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused).
- Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

INFORMATION & COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY

Matraville Sports High School offers a wide range of learning technologies. These facilities, together with the school's teaching and learning programs, provide opportunities for students to enhance their learning and maximize their learning outcomes.

Students have the opportunity to use computers across the curriculum. The school is equipped with two computer laboratories that are used during the year. In order to support student learning it is a school requirement that all Year 7 students are equipped with their own digital learning device. This will enable every student to take advantage of the school technologies and online services. This information booklet contains information and advice about device specifications. Please contact the school if you require guidance or clarification on these matters.

Computing courses are continually being developed and improved to allow students greater access to wider learning experiences using current Technology.

In Year 7, all students take part in the Library and Technology (Mandatory) courses which develop their knowledge of computers and computer applications.

All students will have access to Department of Education secure email and internet facilities on enrolment.

Access to Internet/Technology Policy

Computer rooms are places of learning and hence all school and classroom rules pertaining to the use of classrooms apply to them as well. In addition to those rules, the following cyber safety measures will be taken to ensure continued availability and quality of learning technologies in the school:

- Accessing the learning management portal via Compass.
- It is the student's responsibility to keep backups of their work.
- Individual passwords must not be disclosed to anyone.
- When using a desktop computer in the school, logging out of the system at the end of each session to prevent unauthorized access to their personal files.
- Students are not permitted to provide personal information such as full names, addresses, phone numbers, identifiable photos, etc on the Internet.

Be aware that whilst connected to the network, the students actions may be monitored. This includes the sites they visit, the connections they make, files they download and any attempts to bypass filters in place.

The school uses Google drive and all the free applications associated with Google. Students can access subject specific subject material posted on Google classroom. 15GB of storage space is provided by Google for each student enrolled with the DoE. New curriculum specific apps are added to the Google apps store every week. Google drive is available to students worldwide as long as they have access to a network connection.

Students also have access to other departmental applications including Microsoft 365, and Adobe applications.



What is safe, responsible and respectful student behaviour online?

Be SAFE

- Protect your personal information, including your name, address, school, email address, telephone number, pictures of you and other personal details.
- Only use your own usernames and passwords, and never share them with others.
- Ask a teacher or other responsible adult for help if anyone online asks for your personal information, wants to meet you or offers you money or gifts.
- Let a teacher or other responsible adult know immediately if you find anything online that is suspicious, harmful, inappropriate or makes you uncomfortable.
- Never hack, disable or bypass any hardware or software security, including any virus protection, spam and filter settings.

Be RESPONSIBLE

- Follow all school rules and instructions from school staff, including when using digital devices and online services.
- Take care with the digital devices you use: make sure the devices you bring to school are fully charged each day and are stored appropriately when not in use; understand that you and your parents and carers are responsible for any repairs or IT support your personal devices might need; make sure the devices you bring to school have the latest software installed and take care with the school-owned devices you share with others, so that other people can use them after you.
- Use online services in responsible and age-appropriate ways: only use online services in the ways agreed to with your teacher; only access appropriate content and websites, including when using the school's filtered network and personal, unfiltered networks; and do not use online services to buy or sell things online, to gamble or to do anything that breaks the law.
- Understand that everything done on the school's network is monitored and can be used in investigations, court proceedings or for other legal reasons.

Be RESPECTFUL

- Respect and protect the privacy, safety and wellbeing of others.
- Do not share anyone else's personal information.
- Get permission before you take a photo or video of someone, including from the person and from a teacher.
- Do not harass or bully other students, school staff or anyone, this includes cyberbullying using a digital device or online service.
- Do not send or share messages or content that could cause harm, including things that might be: inappropriate, offensive or abusive; upsetting or embarrassing to another person or group; considered bullying; private or confidential; and/or a virus or other harmful software.
